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DRESS CODE POLICY

Dress code policy is applied from grade 1 to 12 students at the international school of Tallinn. For preschool students the dress code is not required.

All staff members are allowed to check if students are following dress code policy properly. The parents and students are expected to familiarize themselves with the dress code policy.

For not following fully the dress code policy, the following measures are implemented:

CONSEQUENCES

First step – the student will be orally reminded of the obligation to follow the dress code.

Second step – the homeroom teacher will send a message via toddle to parents.

Third step – the ist’s management team will contact parents for a meeting.

Fourth step – the management team will decide on formal consequences.

ACCEPTABLE STANDARDS FOR IST DRESS CODE

Upper body

Shirts:

Colour: long white sleeve or polo collar shirts are strongly preferred. They should be unicolour, without labels. However, the students may also wear very light blue colour shirts. Dark blue or other colours are not allowed.

Style: for the winter season, long sleeve collar shirts are preferred. For the spring season, short sleeve polo shirts are allowed.

Fit: they should be sized appropriately, fitted, and properly buttoned.

IST metallic pin should be attached to the shirts on the chest.

Find below the examples.



For cold weather

During the winter seasons the students can wear a vest, cardigan, sweater, or blazer on top of their white or light blue shirt.

Only shades of royal blue are allowed for the winter wear. Find below the colour guidelines.



In this case, the IST metal pin should be worn over the vest, cardigan, sweater or blazer.

Find below the examples:



Lower body

Pants, skirts and shorts

Colour and style: the students should wear black, navy blue or dark grey tailored pants, skirts or shorts, or black coloured jeans. The size of the skirts and shorts should not be shorter than mid-thigh.

Find below the colour guidelines.



Athletic, oversize, leather, colourful pants, skirts or shorts and blue coloured jeans are not allowed.

Fit: the lower body clothes should not be too tight, too short or have many design elements or patterns. If needed the student can use a belt.

Find below the examples.



Shoes

Colour: shoes must be in black or dark blue colour.

Style: smart, semi-smart, style shoes are strongly recommended (e.g. Chelsea, chunky leather, oxford, monk strap).

During winter seasons long boots are allowed. It is highly recommended to have simple design long boots.

Smart style sandals should be worn with white socks, stockings are also allowed. Sport shoes, shoes with high platform, snow boots, and colourful shoes are not allowed as inside shoes.

Additional wear

PE clothing

Please ensure your child has a set of clothes for pe lessons so they are safe and comfortable for that lesson.

Top:

Style: for PE lessons students will need a PE t-shirt to change into.

Colour: school dress code colours: blue or white

Bottom

Colour: school dress code colours: blue, grey or black

Style: please ensure your child has some leggings or jogging bottoms to change into for **Footwear:** students need suitable footwear for indoor and outdoor PE lessons
